Old Business

- New Printers reporting John-Mark Grabow
 - It was costing HCA \$20,000 a year for Cornerstone's printers & services.
 - We project that in 7 years we have a savings of \$70,000-\$100,000 with this purchase.
 - o John-Mark Grabow found printers to purchase with Precision.
 - We purchased 4 printers- office, copy room, computer lab, and Dawn

- One of the printers needs the drawer replaced.
- We returned the printers to Cornerstone
- We are not getting the support we need. But John Mark is learning the technical portion of the printers, so he can fix what is needed.
- LFW is our tech support & servicing for Learning Lab printer; It's ¼ amount of what we
 had been paying.
- o Sue will set up and share a document with John-Mark to list the issues teachers and students are having so John Mark can troubleshoot during his spare moments.
- Upgrade for our internet speed reporting John- Mark Grabow
 - o Our old speed was grandfathered in at 100 Megabytes but to upgrade to 300MBYTEs a second is cheaper. We have Spectrum and they have not been communicating well with us. They say it will be completed in a week and the next time he talks with them it's two weeks and then a month. And the latest they say they don't even know if they can do it. John Mark will continue to speak with management and try to get to the bottom of these promises.
 - o John-Mark is looking into fiber for next year with a grant.
- We installed about 6 new teacher computers, 4 projectors & 3 TVs.
- Lanschool-
 - Tad came in and helped explore it and to set it up. We still need it to connect to the PCs but it works great with the Chromebooks.
- · A tablet was purchased for Miss Koning at her request. Student Sam Hruska helped resolve some apps issues for her.

New Business

- The Athletic Department is setting up Sports Video for the soccer field. We were asked have an Internet drop & a switch (#46) without POE. They need internet speed of 250 and we are barely at 100. We understand they couldn't get it to work and we wonder if they (TS) could have turned off their routing when they switched off the POE. We are still waiting for final confirmation of what needs to happen next.
- The company coming in to set up the sports video also brought their own switch cases. They didn't need it so they donated it to the school. We will look into whether it can be used or if we should sell them.

- We have been notified of a Chromebook issue by the John Davis family with an app called "Accountable2You". Sue has to figure out how come our Google Admin Console won't allow them to continue to use the app "Accountable2You" on their own device at home.
- Mr. Miner has requested we write up how our school protects our students concerning technology. Sue will work on this. The following is our list of what the school uses:
 - GoGuardian
 - o Bark
 - Google Admin Console
 - Firewall- Meraki
 - Lanschool
- During this discussion there is some question about our anti-virus. Sue will contact TS to find out what we use.
- New Phone System
 - o 3CX
 - Still working out some bugs
 - o New Dedicated phone for Jason they will purchase TMobile 5G with extender
- The new NWEA Testing System needs to be upgraded to 113 version for the Chromebooks. We need to buy enough for 2 classes to test at once (40 Chromebooks) or enough for one class (the largest one of about 20). We barely have enough to use for testing now. We need to start finding quotes to upgrade for these tests.

Eagle Backers Meeting October 2, 2023

Members in attendance - Phil Kilian, Mike Orley, Julie Orley, Kristi Belden, Kelli Luke, Beth Fenstermaker, Todd Foster, and Sue Miller. Denny Heinonen and Matt Miller joined online.

Phil called the meeting to order and opened with prayer.

Eagle Backers has \$41,828 in checking, plus the Cd is \$10,699. Parent Booster USA membership was paid. The CD will automatically renew. We will check rates and decide about renewal. The general fund has approximately 13,000, some funds are going to different places yet.

Senior night is Friday, October 6, for all senior fall athletes. Denny Heinonen will organize the senior parents at volleyball. Kelly will organize soccer and cross country at the soccer field. We will ask Stephanie Jevert for announcer ideas for volleyball and Mr. Alderman to announce soccer/cross country senior athletes. Beth is purchasing flowers and candy for parents. Kristi Belden collected information for the brochures. We are waiting on coaches for their player statements.

Wednesday October 11 and maybe 12 will be soccer districts at HCA. We will do light concessions. Volleyball districts will begin vs Howardsville, October 30, 2023.

Fall Frenzy Review - Amounts in cash boxes at end of night: concessions \$927, gate \$430, swag \$120. Plus \$250 Metro Toyota sponsorship. We still need to deduct expenses. We need to better organize food flow, electrical connections and our cooking surfaces. We need to keep games and student activities outside of the gate area. The powderpuff game could be played on the baseball field.

Soccer field netting is finished as of tonight! Phil asked permission to purchase 2 \$50 gift cards for Black Rock for Joel Schoonbeck and Rob Houtman. They; along with Mike Orley, did much of the work, donated use of equipment, etc. to keep costs down.

Senior banner update - Reorders are submitted. Should be here in time for senior night.soon.

Update for advertising banners for fences from Todd Foster. They will be sold yearly, posted March 1st -November 1st with money going into the general fund. Chris Shamus will design them for about \$50 per banner. Approximately \$300 profit per banner for 4x4 foot banner.

The baseball field irrigation was actually hooked into the school's city water source instead of the soccer field well. We were able to tie the baseball field into pipes used by the greenhouse. The well is now providing the soccer field, green house, and baseball field with water.

Phil officially resigned as President of the Eagle Backers. The group voted Mike Orley as our new president. Phil will be available if needed and plans to attend meetings this year.
